

- $\star$  Unless you have specified otherwise, Lynn will EMAIL you within 3 business days after the meeting as to your status

There is a one-time jury fee which means that after this first jury process, you do not pay another jury fee if you later wish to exhibit in different medium. Please email Lynn if you have any questions.
