Trish Berry gave the schedule of exhibits, which can be found in the newsletter. We have a new venue at Gayton Terrace, senior living community. Trish needs a chairperson for the show. We will not hang at Bank of America until February, 2014. We have always had a short show there as the bank schedules major cleaning during that time period.
